Michael Patrick Santoro Jr., 89, a devoted husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather, passed away Wednesday, July 11, 2018 at Morristown Medical Center surrounded by his loving family.

Born and raised in Newark, he had lived in the Whippany section of Hanover, since 1968.

Mr. Santoro was a 1951 graduate of the Pennsylvania Military College, Chester, PA, with honors in chemistry.

He served as a captain in the United States Army during the Korean Era and the Army Reserves for 18 years.
